

If there is one constant in our lives, it is change. And yet, if there is one thing that is most difficult for us to deal with in this life, it is change.

And yet for people of faith, if there is one expectation of those who choose to invest our lives in following Jesus, it is that we will be changed.

The more and more we read Scripture, the more stories of transformation and change we encounter and the more we come to realize that participating with God in changing to become more like Jesus is a fundamental expectation for those who claim Jesus as Lord of their lives.

No one says it better than the Apostle Paul, who reminds us in Romans 12:2 that we are not to be conformed to the patterns of this world, but that we are to be transformed by the renewing of our minds.

This is a hallmark of the Wesleyan movement, and our understanding and application of sanctification - or the process by which we grow more fully into the image of Jesus by loving God and loving our neighbor - might very well be the most distinctive and best gift that the people called Methodists offer to the world.

Yet, if you have ever tried to change, whether it is your spiritual life or your eating life or any other aspect of your life, you know that change is easier talked about than accomplished.

During the next five weeks, we will be tackling this important topic in our sermon series, Tools For Transformation. We will search the Scriptures to discover not only the image we are to be changed into, but to discover tools to create the conditions in our own lives for change to occur.

Much of our sermon series will engage in conversation with the important work of James Bryan Smith. Several small groups and Sunday School classes in our church have encountered Smith's work in *The Good and Beautiful God*. It is my humble opinion that this is one of the best resources available to help followers of Jesus engage in Christian Spiritual Formation, or put more simply, to be changed by God into the image of Jesus in this world.

Unfortunately, change isn't optional. It's required of all of us on our journey with Jesus. I hope you will participate with us as we travel together on a journey of real change.

HOLSTON CONFERENCE EXCEEDS GOAL; RAISES MORE THAN \$1.1 MILLION FOR IMAGINE NO MALARIA



In the past year, members of our church have collected four-leaf clovers, cut curly hair, staged a talent show and given generously to save lives through Imagine No Malaria. Last year at Annual Conference, Holston Conference set a goal to save 100,000 lives by raising \$1 million to combat the scourge of malaria on the African continent.

It was an audacious goal, a total that would have been the largest amount we had ever raised in one year as an annual conference - and by a wide margin. But on Tuesday, June 11 at Lake Junaluska, our annual conference celebrated the witness

and generosity of so many by announcing that in the last calendar year, not only did the people of Holston Conference meet the goal, but exceeded it by raising \$1,135,250 and saving 113,525 lives in the name of Jesus.

You contributed more than \$16,000 of that final total and we say thank you for all that you have done to save lives in the name of Jesus. May God continue to work through us to change lives in Christ's name.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

We have had a wonderful month of ministry:

- During Vacation Bible School, our children have reminded us that no matter what happens in life, we can stand strong through our faith in God.
- Our high school youth traveled to Cleveland, Ohio, to see up close and personal the face of poverty and to make a difference in the lives of people whom God loves.
- In worship, we have unpacked the core of our faith by learning what it means when we say We Believe.
- Each and every day, children, youth and adults are learning more about what it means to follow Jesus and how to participate in God's work of making disciples and changing lives.

Through the end of May, we have received \$575,663 in contributions. Although this is slightly behind where we were budgeted to be, we remain grateful for your faithfulness to God. Fortunately, we have kept our expenses below budget at \$595,994.

With the various activities that summer holds, churches often see a dip in financial giving during the months of July and August.
