Melissa joined our staff in 2001 as youth director and after serving with excellence and distinction, transitioned into a pastoral role and was eventually ordained an elder in the United Methodist Church in 2010. Melissa has served us well with her enthusiasm, her love of people, her constant prodding to go deeper into mission and service and her leadership and ministry in helping launch and grow The Journey contemporary worship service.

"I am so incredibly grateful for the 12 years that I have spent at Fountain City UMC. When I came as your youth minister in the summer of 2001, I could not even begin to imagine the transition into pastoral ministry that would eventually happen - I just wanted to be in ministry with your teenagers," Melissa said. "I am still amazed at how this journey has taken place in my own life and grateful that you took a chance on me. I cannot even begin to count the ways that you have overlooked my failures and challenged me to grow in new areas. You have helped to shape me into the pastor that I am today and I will continue to strive to grow and develop as a pastor -- but I got my start among you.

"Most of all, I am grateful for the love and support that have been in abundant supply over the last 12 years. You have been there to share in some of the highest and lowest points in my life - my ordination as a full-connection elder, a scary health crisis a few years ago, and the recent death of my dad. You have supported me through your prayers, your hugs, your words of encouragement and so many more expressions of kindness. You have loved me through thick and thin and I am so incredibly grateful for that love and support!

"Indeed I am grateful for the years that I have spent at Fountain City UMC and share the Apostle Paul's sentiment in Ephesians 1:16, "I don't stop giving thanks to God for you."

- We celebrated the total of 5,606 items donated to Fountain City Ministry Center as part of Kids Can For Christ during Lent.
